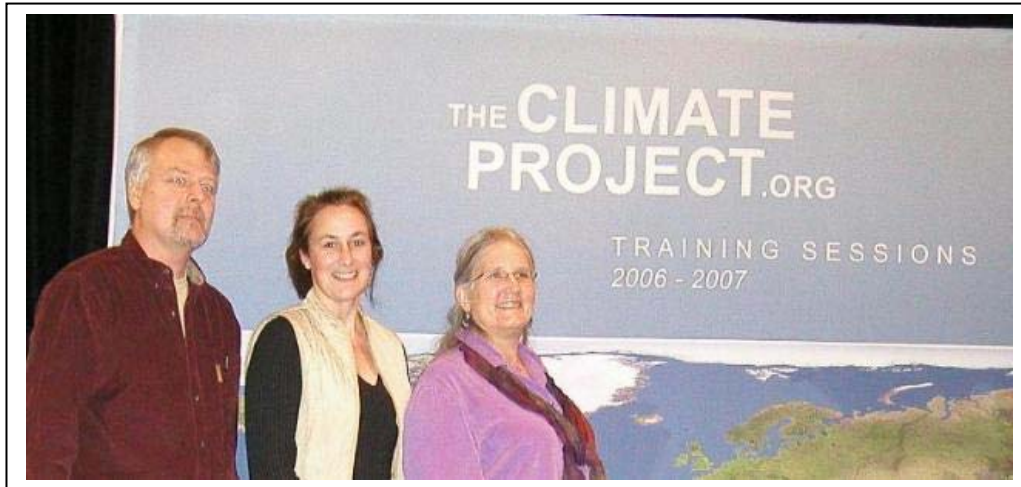

They took part in intensive tutorials about issues surrounding global warming, led by Gore and a team of renowned scientists and environmental educators.
